Not applicable The project falls 3.79 Km Outside the Fambonglho Wildlife Sanctuary and its ESZ. Distance map was dully authenticated by Chief Wildlife Warden, Sikkim. The Eco-sensitive zone of the Fambonglho Wildlife Sanctuary has been notified by the Ministry of Environment Forest and Climate Change vide notification dated 27th August 2014. Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change vide OM Dated 8th August 2019 has relaxed the requirement for prior clearance from Standing Committee of the National Board for Wildlife (SCNBWL) as under. Quote ii. Proposals involving developmental activity/project located outside the stipulated boundary limit of notified ESZ and located within 10 km of National Park/ Wildlife Sanctuary, prior clearance from Standing Committee of the National Board for Wildlife (SCNBWL) may not be applicable. However such proposals from environmental angle including impact of developmental activity/project on the wildlife habitat, if any, would be examined by the sector specific Expert Appraisal Committee and appropriate conservation measures in the form of recommendations shall be made.
